## 5-hour Advanced Restorative Circle Training: Facilitating the Topics of COVID-19 and Racism



Communities have been negatively impacted by the recent traumatic events in our world. In order to prepare for academic learning, it is critical to have conversations to process the trauma. This training will provide teachers and other educators with the tools to connect with students to proactively discuss COVID-19 and Racism.



Proactive restorative circles can be used to create safe spaces for everyone to openly discuss difficult topics. This advanced training builds on the Introduction to Restorative Practices and Using Circles Effectively, two-day training. It is highly recommended that participants complete the two-day training, but it is not required for this training.

Restorative Practices is an evidence-based science that works to help communities build positive relationships, repair harm, and help heal the impact of community-wide trauma. Restorative Practices aligns with the MTSS as a PBIS for Tier I, II and III interventions.
